Often these sessions prepare pupils to take part in an inter school competition and the opportunity to learn a new inclusive sport such as Boccia, Polybat or New Age Kurling. Sessions from the dance specialist; one per week over a half term, follow up with one class for another half term as preparation for the Dance Festival. Feedback from staff and parents are that these sessions support a child. Staff log behaviours following sessions and the impact of this therapeutic approach is extremely favourable. Debbie Hurst has provided TA training in Hand massage which follows a similar approach to reflexology. This has enabled us to extend the use of reflexology massage across the school All the children have had the opportunity to experience Yoga sessions. For some classes the impact of these sessions have supported children in self-regulation and enabled them to link the
