

Why is permission being sought?	What are the school's responsibilities?

So that parents and children can film authorised events (nativity plays, school trips etc). E-Safety Rules for Key Stage 2

At Hayfield School:

- We send e-mails that are polite and friendly.
- We never give out personal information or passwords.

- We do not open e-mails sent by anyone we don't know.
- We do not use Internet chat rooms.
- We do not use mobile phones in school.
